Release cadence / change model	Quarterly updates ("every three months") with a mix of features delivered enabled vs opt-in/disabled (customer action required).	Microsoft publishes product documentation hubs and structured release information (useful for communicating ongoing innovation and enablement to stakeholders).
User adoption & enablement	Adoption typically managed via Oracle's readiness/opt-in process each quarter.	Large enablement surface via Microsoft Learn documentation/training across Finance and SCM (helpful for change management and role-based onboarding).
"Why switch?" (clean migration message)	Great fit if you're standardized on Oracle Cloud Apps and want that quarterly update model with opt-in feature control.	Strong fit if you want a clearly defined end-to-end supply chain suite plus finance positioned for real-time global visibility , backed by Microsoft's documentation/training ecosystem.
