

# Oracle Netsuite vs Dynamics 365 Finance & Supply Chain (D365 F&O): side-by-side comparison



Dimension	Oracle NetSuite today	Dynamics 365 Finance & Supply Chain Management (what you gain)
<b>Best-fit intent</b>	Cloud ERP suite focused on automating core processes and delivering real-time operational/financial insight.	Enterprise ERP for scaling <b>global finance</b> plus end-to-end <b>supply chain execution</b> with Microsoft's platform + ecosystem.
<b>Finance capabilities</b>	Core ERP financials (scope varies by modules/edition).	Dynamics 365 Finance supports financial ops such as managing invoices/payments and regular financial reporting (with broader finance capabilities across the product).
<b>Supply chain depth (clear capability map)</b>	Operational scope depends on what NetSuite modules you run (manufacturing/WMS/etc. vary by customer). Dynamics 365 Finance positions <b>financial reporting + embedded analytics + AI-driven insights</b> , and SCM messaging emphasizes visibility and planning/fulfillment optimization.
<b>Extensibility / platform story</b>	NetSuite's platform approach is documented across product areas (ERP, SuiteCloud, SuiteAnalytics, etc.), and customization is typically handled through NetSuite's platform capabilities and partner ecosystem.	Microsoft provides extensive documentation for implementation, data management, integration, and customization across Dynamics 365 Finance and Supply Chain apps (including integration patterns and platform tooling).
<b>Roadmap transparency</b>	Roadmap visibility depends on Oracle/NetSuite communications and your customer program.	Microsoft publishes <b>release wave plans</b> (what's new/planned) for both Finance and Supply Chain Management—useful for exec buyers who want predictable innovation visibility.
